### EVELYN FANG, MD '98 • TAIWAN



Dr. Evelyn Fang is the director of the United Family Healthcare Center for Primary Care Education and Practice in the Department of Family Medicine at Beijing United Family Hospital (BJU), a revolutionary international standard health care organization with four sites in China, each dedicated to providing comprehensive, fully integrated health care services with compassion and care. It is her second stint at United Family Hospitals (UFH) Clinics in Beijing, having practiced family and internal medicine from 2005 to 2009. Dr. Fang went on to become service director of the internal medicine hospitalist department at the Alaska Native Medical Center from 2010 to 2012. Dr. Fang also holds a master's degree in public health, with emphasis on health administration, from the California State University in Fresno.

### SELVAM MASCARENHAS, MD '91 • INDIA



Dr. Selvam Mascarenhas is a staff hospitalist medical doctor at Christiana Care Health System, one of the largest health care providers in the mid-Atlantic region, serving all of Delaware and portions of seven counties bordering the state in Pennsylvania, Maryland and New Jersey.

Dr. Mascarenhas entered the premedical sciences program at St. George's University School of Medicine at age 18, after completing secondary school in his home country of India, and graduated with his Doctor of Medicine degree in 2002. He went on to complete his residency in internal medicine at Norwalk Hospital in Connecticut, an affiliate of Yale University School of Medicine. Dr. Mascarenhas joined Christiana Care Health System in 2006.

### KENNETH YEUNG, MD '02 • HONG KONG



Born and raised in Hong Kong, Dr. Kenneth Yeung is currently a family medicine practitioner at Palo Alto Medical Foundation's Fremont office in California, handling a wide range of cases from people of all ages. Prior to that, he was an adult medicine/pediatrics attending physician at South Cove Community Health Center in Boston, Massachusetts. Everyday he has an opportunity to apply the skills and training he learned while working toward his MD. "SGU was a life-changing experience for me," Dr. Yeung said. 
### THE CAMPUS

## Admissions and Academic Structure

St. George's University offers a range of entry options to our Doctor of Medicine and Veterinary Medicine programs. Our seven-, six-, five-, or four-year MD or DVM programs cater to applicants of all ages and academic qualifications. Below you will find a diagram of our academic structure and entry requirements for each level of our MD and DVM programs.

Classes begin in August and January of each year.

**August Matriculation:** The application and all supporting documentation must be received by **June 15** of the same year.

**January Matriculation:** The application and all supporting documentation must be received by **November 15** of the preceding year.

*Prospective candidates should note that the entering classes are highly competitive and those applications completed early have the advantage of being reviewed at the beginning of the admission process.*
