### KEITH B. TAYLOR GLOBAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM\*

Residency programs are continuing to place more emphasis on global medicine—and seeking new residents with this experience. Participating in the Keith B. Taylor Global Scholars Program offers the unique opportunity to spend the first year of Basic Medical Sciences at Northumbria University in Newcastle, England, followed by study in Grenada and clinical rotations in the US, Canada, UK, and Grenada.

### DUAL DEGREE OPPORTUNITIES

Dual degrees are available in the MD program for public health in a combined MD/MPH, which can be earned in less than five years. In addition, you may consider the freestanding Master of Public Health (MPH) degree from our Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH) accredited program, in which you would learn how to both prevent and treat public health issues.



## Getting Into Medical School May Not Be Easy. Affording It Should Be.

St. George's University is dedicated to ensuring the best students have access to the best medical education. We've developed a range of scholarships for qualified Canadian students to help make their dreams a reality.

- **Chancellor's Circle of the Legacy of Excellence Scholarship.** An automatic award of \$81,000 to students with a minimum overall undergraduate GPA of 3.7, a 3.5 science GPA, and a 29 (old)/508 (new) MCAT score who have been accepted by the Committee on Admission. This scholarship is awarded to the first 50 qualified students in each class to accept it and is distributed over four years. Students must have a bachelor's degree from a US or Canadian institution.
- **The Legacy of Excellence Scholarship.** An award to students demonstrating academic excellence in their undergraduate education. Students must have a bachelor's degree from a US or Canadian institution. Scholarship awards are determined by academic merit and financial need.
- **The International Peace Scholarship.** An award to non-US citizen/permanent residents who exhibit academic excellence and demonstrate financial need. This program is committed to promoting a student body made up of diverse nationalities and cultural backgrounds, which in the future will contribute to a worldwide medical community. Application required.
- **The Global Medicine Scholarship.** An award to non-US citizen/permanent residents entering the Keith B. Taylor Global Scholars Program who exhibit academic excellence and demonstrate financial need. Application required.


## Canadian Students Succeed at St. George's University




#### AUSTIN ENRIGHT, MD '11
